Aaron and Lyndsey met 10 years ago and have been married for seven. They started trying to conceive four years ago after Lyndsey graduated as an RN. In 2015, after a laparoscopy it was confirmed that Lyndsey had endometriosis and a blocked fallopian tube. They had seen two reproductive endocrinologists and had been through at least 12 Clomid cycles and 8 IUI's with injectable medications. Each cycle ended in heartbreak and a depleted bank account.

The third specialist left them with great hope.

From an early test, they thought the trouble was a male factor. To be safe they tried all their options. They first started off with doing an IUI. That ended in failure. After a myomectomy, they believed IVF would work. Sadly after two attempts of IVF, the doctor realized that Megan had an egg quality problem. He recommended using donor eggs. The next challenge they faced was how to fund this procedure. Once they did some research and learned of Baby Quest, Megan applied and crossed her fingers. Now they are waiting to find a donor who can help them realize their dream of becoming parents.

Being diagnosed with infertility in your 20's seems impossible to imagine. Even worse, is enduring years of back to back failed fertility treatment as Erika and Curtis had. After two years of trying to conceive, their Doctor recommended IVF. In the process of preparing for IVF the couple learned they were both carriers of Cystic Fibrosis, which changed the course of treatment to include PGD testing for the embryos.
